Rev. Illéné begins this appointment, which is approximately 10 hours per week, as of July 1. She will be working in partnership with Seth Schroerlucke, while she also continues as the pastor at Trinity UMC. Funding for this position comes from a grant to First Church by Garrett Evangelical Theological Seminary. The grant is for \$10,000 per year for the next two years.
